A WOODSTOCK FOR HACKERS

Every four years, the ‘community that builds the internet’ will gather on a field for the largest technology and security conference out there. They have done so since 1989. In 2022, this will occur on the fields of MCH2022, from the 22nd till the 26th of July, near Zeewolde. Here they will discuss the state of contemporary technology, it’s future and the social and political consequences of their work.

Over the years the conference grew in many ways. People from various walks of life met to discuss, learn, share, envision and build the future. While their interest is in technology, the sociological and political consequences of their work are debated. The atmosphere in which these debates ensue is compelling; friendly, welcoming, relaxing and

respectful. This also lead to an energy that sprouts new ideas, projects and collaborations between the participants.

In 2022, there will be very few places in the world where “the internet” is not available in one form or another. Most people have multiple devices that access the internet. This makes the questions posed in 1989 even more relevant. How do we deal with technology? How do we secure ourselves?

The 6th edition of the festival is themed by the name “May Contain Hackers”. MCH2022 builds on the foundations of 3 decades of ethical hacking and aims to further the answers on these and many other questions.

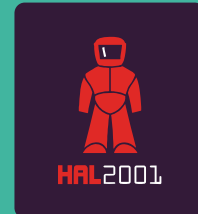

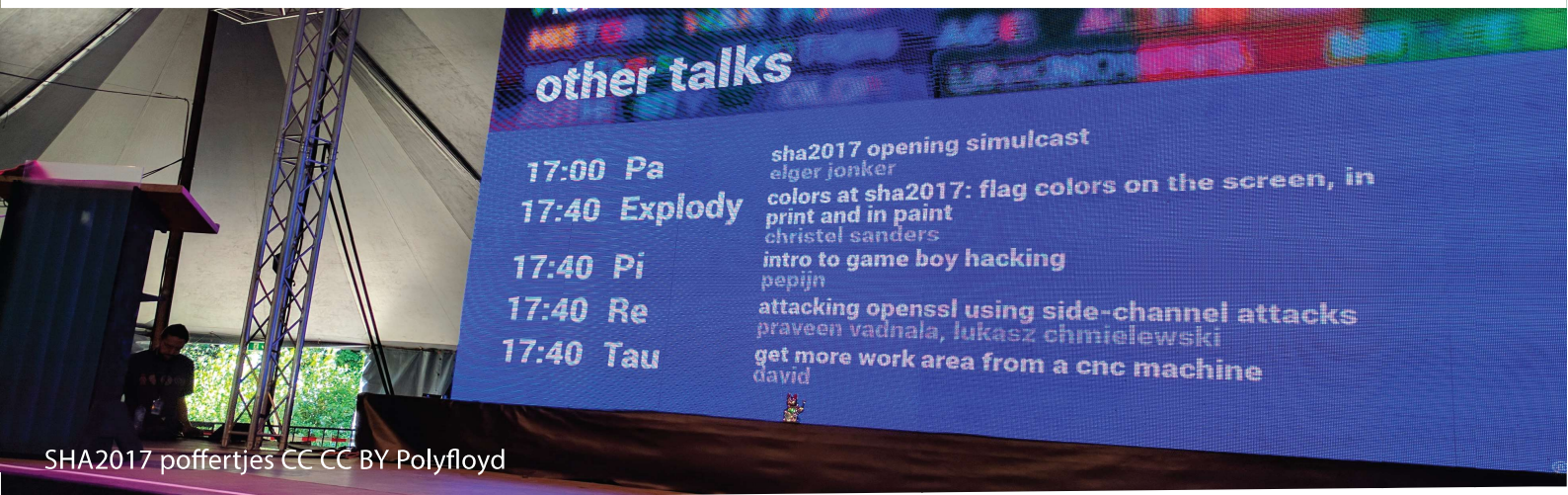

During the events there are many wonderful activities, either organised by the volunteers or by the visitors themselves. Think about speakers from around the world, decentralised parties, repurposed hoverboards, a custom electronic badge for all visitors and a working fire truck for hacking.



ENLIGHTNING TALKS

Over the years the talks at the Dutch events have been the reason alone to participate. MCH2022 will also have multiple stages for talks. There will be a public CFP which will result in talks from the most interesting speakers around the globe. Subjects are deep technical subjects like encryption, more soft matters like neural diversity and political subjects.

It is to be expected that these talks are the cutting edge on scientific research and technological advances, often given by the researchers and inventors or creators themselves. Many of these talks lead to collabo-

ration in different parts of science and it is not uncommon that new insights are formed on the event itself.

Talks are organized by a separate independent team to ensure maximum quality and diversity. The MCH2022 event will, like previous events, attract a large number of professionals.

ELECTRONIC EVENT BADGE

In recent years, electronic badges became commonplace at high-tech events like MCH2022. The downside of the badges was that you couldn't read someone's name on the badge. At SHA2017 a new badge concept with a readable name tag was introduced.

The wifi-connected board had a programmable core (Espressif's ESP32) and featured apps written in micropython. This was at the time an unique concept and is very user-friendly. Many apps were written by visitors during and after the event. Due to the readable and low-energy e-ink screen the badges found a useful life after SHA and are in use until this day! This badge was an enormous success. The concept has since been repeated on multiple events with an active community[1].

For 2022, a new badge is planned. Having a badge at the event gives participants a different way of interacting with each other, learn about technology and participate in various activities. Sponsors can develop their own application that can be installed through an app store and use the badge platform to highlight their presence and activities on the terrain.

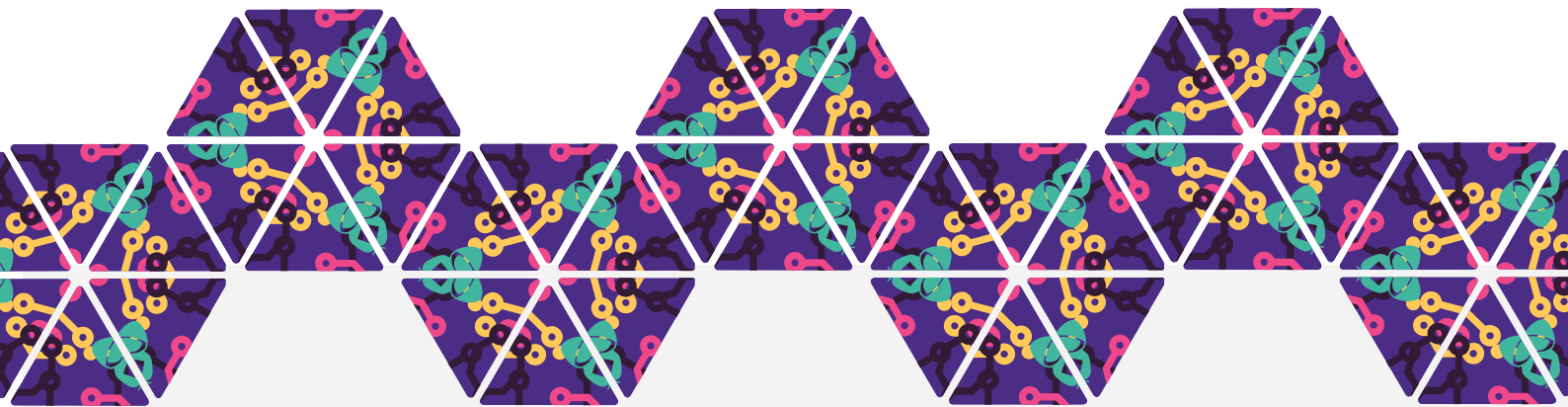
